Impact of the Crusades Presentation

Directions

In groups of 2 or 3, students will choose and research one of the available topics about the impacts of the Crusades. Each group will be required to present the information to the class in a format of their choosing. The presentation must last between 3-5 minutes. At the conclusion of the presentation students will be asked to answer questions from their fellow students and the teacher. Students will be graded on: organization, subject knowledge, visual aids, mechanics, verbal techniques, and group work. For specific grading expectations on each of the segments, see attached rubric.

Students are expected to explain the impact that the entire Crusades had on each topic. The presentation needs to focus on the end results of the Crusades, not an active occurring event during the Crusades. Students need to have at least 3 specific points to reference the impacts. Students must also source their information from appropriate credible cites.
